2 Eligibility for Presentation

Individual presentation: As an individual presenter, you must be a member of JACAP, though your co-author may be a non-member.

Workshop: As a workshop organizer, you must be a member of JACAP, though other workshop presenters may be non-members.

Poster presentation: As a poster presenter, you may be a non-member of JACAP.

-In all cases, you can acquire the eligibility by becoming a JACAP member now and paying a membership fee for the fiscal year of 2014 and 2015.

-All new members must pay a membership fee for the fiscal year of 2016 (i.e., you cannot quit the association without paying the fee).

-Please send a membership application along with your paper proposal.

3 Types of presentation

(1) Individual presentation

There are two categories of individual presentation, LONG and SHORT.

LONG: Fifty (50) minutes in total (leave at least 12 minutes for questions and discussions).

SHORT: Twenty-five (25) minutes in total (leave at least 8 minutes for questions and discussions).

Please specify your preferred category in your proposal. However, we may not meet your preference due to the number of presentations.

Proposal: 1200-2000 characters in Japanese, or 600-1000 words in English.

(2) Workshop

Two hours including questions and discussions. However, the time may be shortened if we have many workshop proposals.

Proposal: 1600-2400 characters in Japanese, or 800-1200 words in English.

(3) Poster presentation

Proposal: 800-1600 characters in Japanese, or 400-800 words in English.

4 How to send your proposal

If you want to present a paper or organize a workshop, please send your proposal via Google Form (https://docs.google.com/forms/d/13bveSVXT-q2QxSCO_g0DrAZYE4SCr21BkLtdmG5cWvg/viewform) by 15th February 2016.

5 Decision

Your proposal will be reviewed by the steering committee of the annual meeting, and the result will be sent to you in the middle of February via e-mail.

It is possible that the category of presentation admitted is different from the one you proposed.

6 A Best Presentation Award

A Best Presentation Award will be conferred to the presenter(s) of a long presentation at the annual meeting of the Japan Society for Contemporary and Applied Philosophy, based on the best combined marks of presentation skills and quality evaluated by the Best Presentation Award Committee and acknowledged by the Executive Board. To apply for the Best Presentation Award, the presentation needs to be in the long presentation category. In addition, following the procedure specified in the application form, an applicant needs to send another long abstract besides a regular abstract for presentation application. 7 Management of the annual meeting

(1) This annual meeting is managed by a DO-IT-YOURSELF style.

-Basically there will be no personnel for each session room: no microphone handlers and no time keepers.

-If you need to use a PC, please bring in your own (projectors are equipped in session rooms).

-All other managerial issues in the session room should be handled by session chair and presenters.

(2) The main language of the annual meeting is Japanese. Although we accept presentations and workshops in both Japanese and English, we expect that majority of the sessions (including the plenary session) will be in Japanese. We will do our best to make English-speaking participants comfortable, but please be prepared for a Japanese-dominant environment.
